A reflection on still waters, from Psalm 23, verse two:

***“...he leadeth me beside the still waters.”***

(Psalm 23:1 KJV)

My dear friends,

This is the seventh Sunday we've been apart, worshipping away from our church. We have done the best we can to provide a "virtual" Worship service. God has been glorified and praised each week. Still, we look forward to when we can worship together again. For these are strange, uncertain times. We would rather worship together. During the week, we find that too easily we are sad, filled with anxiety, searching for a better way...and then today we hear:

## The Lord is My Shepherd...

*If it be the Good Shepherd who leadeth me;  
If our destination are His Still Waters;  
His Still Waters are peaceful and calm;  
His Waters are filled with Grace;  
His Waters are welcoming;*

*I want to follow!  
I want to go, for my waters are turbulent.  
Mine are chaotic and wild.  
Mine are just full of trouble.
